

Transfer between terminals

The transfer from one terminal to the other can be made on foot, and there are moving walkways and escalators for greater convenience.

A shuttle service also operates between the terminals. In Terminal 1, stops are located at Gate 1 of the Domestic Departures Hall and Gate 8 of the International Departures Hall. In Terminal 2, the shuttle stops at Gate 23 of the Domestic Departures Hall and Gate 27 of the International Departures Hall.

Transfer between Pudong International Airport and Hongqiao International Airport

Lufthansa flights are exclusively handled at Pudong International Airport. Hongqiao International Airport is now almost only used for domestic Chinese connections and services to Korea and Japan, among others. Shanghai's two airports are roughly 50 kilometers apart. The most convenient modes of transportation to transfer from one to the other are the Maglev, or Transrapid, train and line 2 of the city's Metro network, for both of which it is wise to plan a good 90 minutes. There is also a shuttle service (Line 1), with buses running every 20 minutes between 6 a.m. and 11 p.m. (Tel: +86-21/68 34 66 12). The buses also take roughly 90 minutes for the journey (depending on the traffic).

Information

There are several information counters in both terminals and also near the Maglev train station, where tourist and flight information can be obtained. There's also an information hotline that can be reached on: +86-21/96 990.



How to get there

Car Parking

Parking lots and garages (fee-based) are available at the airport. Parking on P1 and P2 is a little more expensive than on P4 and P5.

Driving Directions

Follow the S1 Yingbin Expressway as far as the Hongqiao Gang intersection, from there continue west. The street later becomes the S20 Outer Ring Expressway and takes you around the city as far as Hongqiao International Airport.

To reach the city center, you also first take the S1 Yingbin Expressway as far as the Hongqiao Gang intersection, continue west from there and via the S20 Outer Ring Expressway, but then you turn north onto the X611 Luoshan Road. In Panqiaocun, the X611 becomes the Inner Ring Elevated Road, which crosses the Huangpu River in Yanpu. If you are traveling to Pudong Business District, turn off earlier, at Tielangan Bridge, to head west on the X001 Yanggao Middle Road.

Public transportation

Maglev und Metro

The Maglev (smtdc.com), or Shanghai Transrapid, is a magnetic levitation train line providing daily services from around 7 a.m. to 9.30 p.m. between Pudong International Airport and the Metro Line 2 stop, Longyang Road. Line 2 connects the Pudong and Puxi districts via the city center and Hongqiao International Airport.

Trains

Shanghai has four train stations from which travelers can continue their journey to cities almost everywhere in China. From the Hongqiao Transport Hub, for example, you can make the journey to Beijing in roughly five hours. Trains departing the South Railway Station serve the southern provinces, those from Shanghai West Railway Station serve cities in the surrounding region, including Nanjing, Suzhou and Wuxi, while the destinations to be reached from Shanghai Railway Station include Hong Kong, and on night trains, Beijing and Xian.

Bus

A number of bus routes connect the airport with various districts of Shanghai. Stops are located outside both terminal buildings. Line 1, for example, will take you all the way to Hongqiao International Airport and Line 2 as far as the City Terminal at Jing'an Temple. A night bus also runs via the city center to Hongqiao International Airport.

Intercity buses

A number of intercity buses provide daily services between Pudong International Airport and larger cities, such as Wenzhou, Hangzhou, Wuxi and Qingtian.

Taxis

Taxis are available outside both terminal buildings. The journey into downtown Shanghai takes roughly an hour (depending on the traffic). A nighttime surcharge is payable between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. Travelers are recommended to use only licensed taxis and always to make sure that the meter is switched on. Useful tip: Not all taxi drivers can speak or read English, so it's wise to always take along your destination address written down in Chinese.



Facilities & infrastructure

Money

There are several bank branches, currency exchanges and ATMs of Chinese and international banks in both terminals.

Communications

Wi-Fi Internet access is available. There are Post Office counters in Terminals 1 and 2 (in Terminal 1 at the southern entrance of the International Departures Hall, Tel: +86-21/68 34 68 58 and near Gates 12 and 14 in the Domestic Departures Hall, and in Terminal 2, near Island B in the Departures Hall).

Food

Both terminals have a wide selection of restaurants, fast-food outlets, cafés and bars on both sides of the security checkpoint, many of them on level 3.

Shopping

Stores selling travel essentials, souvenirs, luxury articles, food and delicatessen items as well as duty-free shops can be found on both sides of the security checkpoint in both terminals.

Other

Mobile device charging stations are located on level 1 of Terminal 1, at Gate 8 in the Arrivals Hall and Gate 6 in the Departures Hall. The Airport Police can be reached on Tel: +86-21/68 34 565. First aid is dispensed at the airport clinic, which has offices in room A2-210, 2F, in the Domestic Arrivals Hall (Tel: +86-21/68 34 53 28), between Gates 6 and 7, in the Domestic Departures Hall (Tel: +86-21/ 68 34 53 76) and room C2-213, 2 F, in the International Arrivals Hall.

Luggage

Terminals 1 and 2 each provide a baggage storage facility on the departures level (telephone in Terminal 1: +86-21/68 34 63 24; in Terminal 2 +86-21/68 34 00 76, open from 6 a.m. through 23 p.m.). There is also a Lost & Found office in each terminal (in Terminal 1 between Gates 6 and 7 in the Departures Hall, Tel: +86-21/68 34 63 24; in Terminal 2 near Island L in the Departures Hall, Tel: +86-21/68 34 04 17, open from 6 a.m. through 23 p.m.). Baggage carts can be found on both sides of the security checkpoints.

Conference & Business

A business center with telephone, fax and Internet connections is located in both Terminal 1 (Arrivals Hall) and Terminal 2 (Arrivals Hall and Island B of the Departures Hall).

A number of airport hotels also provide conference facilities, including the Ramada Plaza Pudong Airport Shanghai Hotel (ramada.co.uk; Tel: +86-21/38 49 49 49).



Accessibility

The airport is accessible to travelers with impaired mobility. Barrier-free facilities include toilets for people with disabilities, elevators and wheelchair ramps.
